1 About TD Browse

1.1 Intended Use

TD Browse is a custom-built app for browsing the web with just your eyes in a familiar way, even without previous eye tracking experience. It is custom designed for people who cannot use their hands to browse the internet, with conditions such as ALS, CP, spinal cord injury or traumatic brain injury. Scroll, surf and click in a familiar intuitive way and switch easily and naturally between these functions. Hit large and small target with ease and precision plus quickly jump to preferred websites from the browsing history.

TD Browse has been built to encourage quick success for those new to eye gaze. TD Browse design prioritizes the content of the website so that a person feels immersed in their browsing experience. On average, in user testing, it has taken them less than 5 minutes to get up and running with TD Browse.

TD Browse gives people who use eye gaze a simple way to enjoy the web.



The Home Page is the first page the user sees when TD Browse is launched, except for first launch. On the Home Page there are eight (8) links to different web pages. The Getting Started Tutorial will disappear automatically after a while, but will remain on the Home Page for easy access in the beginning. The links on the Home Page will automatically change into the most viewed web pages over time. The links on the Home Page are called Top Sites.

3.5 Track Status Box




Illustration 3: Track Status Box

The **Track Status** function checks if the user is correctly positioned in front of the eye tracker.

- The two (2) white dots The user's eyes and how they are positioned towards the screen. For optimal position, the
 white dots should be in the middle of the black area.
- The colorful bar on the left with the white arrow How far or close the user is positioned from the screen.
 - If the white arrow is in the middle of the green area of the bar, the user is at the optimal distance from the
 - If the arrow is in the lower part of the bar move the user closer to the eye tracker.
 - If the arrow is in the upper part of the bar move the user further away from the eye tracker.

4 Using TD Browse

TD Browse is purpose-built for eye gaze. It makes browsing the Internet easy while reducing the risks of unwanted clicks.



Most of the functions/actions in TD Browse are also Touch and Mouse enabled, making it easier for a Caregiver or Assistant to help the user if needed. The Caregiver or Assistant can select an Action or change the settings for the user much easier.

4.1 The Actions in the Main Screen

The Interaction Toggle is always available on the right side of the screen. It will turn blue as you switch between Scroll Mode and Click Mode. The icon you see shows what mode you are currently in. The Interaction Toggle toggles between Scroll Mode and Click Mode.

For web URLs we specifically do not use Swiftkey for word prediction. TD Browse relies on search suggestion based off geolocation (which ensures that the search suggestions are context relevant) for web URLs.

4.1.3.1.1 Keyboard

Depending on the language, the Keyboard consists of three (3) keyboard pages, depending on the language. The user

can easily switch between the different keyboard pages by selecting one of these buttons

The key on the keyboard where the user is gazing will be indicated by a light frame around the character/function

on the key, and when the key is selected, it will change color briefly to the set activation color




Illustration 6: The Keyboard Page

4.1.3.1.1.2 Word Prediction

The word prediction engine used in TD Browse for text fields is from SwiftKey[™] and is commonly used in tablets and smartphones. SwiftKey[™] uses a blend of artificial intelligence technologies to predict the next word the user intends to type. SwiftKey[™] learns from previous texts the user has written and output predictions based on the current input text and what it has learned. The Word Prediction language will change depending on the Keyboard Language setting.




Illustration 9: Keyboard with Swift Key Prediction




Illustration 10: Keyboard with Geo-search Prediction

When Word Prediction is in use, three (3) boxes will appear above the Keyboard. The prediction buttons are smart and predict geographically-based Search Suggestions when typing a URL but offer word prediction when typing into a text field. The leftmost box will display the most probable predicted word, and the remaining two (2) boxes will contain one predicted word each. To select a predicted word, select the box with the correct word in it. If you can't find the word you are looking for, just keep on typing, and hopefully, the word you are looking for will appear after the next character.

If you are using Word Prediction and want to type a word containing an accent, like café, you will save time and effort by letting Word Prediction handle the accent. Simply type "cafe", and you will get a suggestion for "café".




4.2.3 Pause in TD Browse

Using eye gaze is a repeated physical task, and the muscles in use around the eyes can become fatigued. Pausing gaze not only gives you time to look at the screen without interacting but also provides your eyes with time to rest.



5.2 Calibration



5.2.1 How does the Calibration Process Work in TD Browse?


The calibration process works as follows:

The Test Calibration will be shown when a calibration starts, whether it is a Quick Calibration or a regular Calibration. This page offers you the chance to assess the quality of your calibration.


On the test calibration screen, there are circles with a small dot in the center. The blue dot shows where the user is looking. Fixating the gaze on one of the dots, it shows where the eye tracker registers the fixation in that dot and how small or large offset there is.



If the blue circle is within the dotted white circle, then the calibration is good enough for using TD Browse.



When the Calibrate button is selected, the first calibration screen will appear. It is a black screen, and in the center of the screen, there is one single blue dot with a black center.



Nothing will happen until the user fixates the gaze on the dot, the eye tracker will register the fixation, and the dot will blink once and disappear.



As long as the dot remains on the screen, the eye tracker has not registered the gaze data for that position

A new screen will appear. It is a black screen, and in the four corners, an blue dot with the black center will be present.

Nothing will happen until the user fixates the gaze on one of the dots, the eye tracker will register the fixation on that dot, and the dot will blink once and disappear.



As long as the dot remains on the screen, the eye tracker has not registered the gaze data for that position

When the user's have fixated the gaze upon all of the dots on the screen, and all of the dots have disappeared, the calibration process finishes and the test calibration screen will show up again.

Try out the calibration by looking at the circles on the screen. Close the test calibration screen or start a new calibration if needed.





- 4. Look for the (Calibration) icon to find the correct settings card.
- 5. Select the Open button.
- 6. Select the Display Setup button.
 - This button is not Gaze enabled and must be selected by touch or by Mouse.
- 7. Follow the on-screen instructions.

- 9. Select the (Back) button to go back to TD Browse Settings.

5.3 Keyboard



Language

The selected language keyboard layout is shown. Select the **Add/Change** button to change the keyboard layout to another language. There are several different language keyboard layouts available.




Illustration 11: TD Switcher


